## Group Break Out Sessions

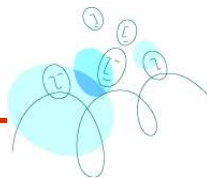

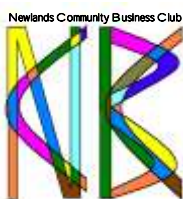
